# **Spring Cleaning**

The Christian celebration of Lent is a time for reflection and repentence. Annette Poitier who lives in Nassau, Bahamas, writes:

IN our family of islands, some people have a peculiar way of spring cleaning their houses. First, everything is taken out of the house and placed outside. Then the house is washed and scrubbed, and so are the contents. When the house is clean, the owners put back in only those things that are cherished. Some items are discarded because they have become old or broken. Others have become redundant. Some items are offered to families or charities who may find better use for them.

This practice offers a model for our self-examination. As we bring everything about ourselves into the light of God's love, asking for cleansing, God will help us to see what we should keep and what we need to let go of.

**PRAYER**: Help us, O God, to place all of our deeds in your light. We know that when we reflect your light, we become channels of love and peace for others. Cleanse us continually as we travel on the journey of life.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY: Our spiritual house needs spring cleaning.

**Psalm 139**:1 O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my every thought when far away.

You chart the path ahead of me and tell me where to stop and rest. Every moment you know where I am. You know what I am going to say even before I say it, LORD. You both precede and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head.

You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb. You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb. You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed.

How precious are your thoughts about me, O God! They are innumerable! I can't even count them; they outnumber the grains of sand! And when I wake up in the morning, you are still with me!
